Friday last a signal was made on Cork harbour, for the appearance of a fleet of ships, supposed to be Indiamen, off Cape Clear.

The imports of black teas and sugars on Saturday last, in Cork, amounted to nearly six thousand pounds, and on wines, to about three thousand.

There are still large imports of leather, both tanned and carried from England, though the far greater part of our raw and salted hides and skins are sent over from hence, from whence we again receive them in a manufactured state.
