The Meteor bomb, Capt. Collins, arrived on

went to the village described, and, judge of his
astonishment, when, as he passed a meeting house,

prisoner. He was brought to Chester Castle on
the 3d ult.

Saturday, — Hudd, keeper of a house de-
voted to the votaries of Venus, in Tooley-street,
brought an action, in the Palace-court, against a

Two parties of Cyprians attended, whose testi-
mony was completely at variance. The plaintiff
obtained a verdict, with one shilling damages.

Saturday, J. Hardy, servant to a Lecturer in
Anatomy, was committed for re-examination, from
the Thames Police-office, for stealing a dead body
from Bermondsey Church-yard. J. Williams was
the same day convicted in the penalty of 20l. for
obtaining a place with a forged character, but be-
ing unable to pay the same, he was committed
for two months to the House of Correction.

A few days since, a boy eight years old, while
bathing at Whitby, was thrown down by a per-
son, who jocularly threatened to drown him.—
The fright produced convulsions, which caused
his death the ensuing day.

LIMERICK, JULY 8.

Letters Patent are said to be preparing, and
will soon pass the Great Seal, granting a pension
of £4000 a year to the Irish Chancellor, in the
event of his retiring from his present situation.—
Sir Michael Smith, the Master of the Rolls, re-
ceives a compensation of 2000l. per annum; his
deputy, Mr. Ridgway, 500l.

The celebrated painting of the death of Lord
Chatham, valued at 2500 guineas, was not pur-
chased by Mr. Davison, for 2000 guineas, as stated
in some of the English prints. Twenty-five noble-
men and gentlemen staked 100 guineas each, and
drew lots for it, and Mr. Davison happened to
draw the fortunate lot, so that the picture cost
him only 100 guineas.

Last Sunday morning, as two young women of

ald, were bathing at the Custom-house quay,
unacquainted with the situation of the place, sud-
denly passed their depth, and before any assis-
tance could be given, both unfortunately perished.
The bodies were taken up a few minutes after,
and every effort made to restore animation, but
without effect.

Same night, Thomas Fitzgerald, weaver, at
Boherbuoy, descending a ladder from a loft in his
house, fell down, and was killed on the spot.

The homeward-bound West India Fleet, 95 sail
in number, sailed from Tortola on the 11th of
May, under convoy of the Amelia, Princess Char-
lotte, and Unicorn frigates. On the 29th of
May, they were chased by four large French fri-
gates. The Kingston, captain Ladd, one of the
convoy, has arrived in Cork harbour: she parted
from the fleet last Monday week, all well.
