On Tuesday night se'nnight, the sloop St. John Baptist, of Youghal, — Poe, master, bound from Cork to Dublin, with whiskey, hides, and paper, sprung a leak about two leagues from the Tower of Hook. By the exertions of the crew, aided by pilots from the fort of Rosslare, she was safely brought into Wexford the following morning, and the cargo lodged in his Majesty's stores, without receiving much injury.

The growth of Grain on the Continent now promises a very abundant harvest. Flour, in Spain and Portugal, is now scarce saleable at seven or eight dollars a barrel.

The very imprudent practice of suffering young boys to ride horses to water, which they are unable to manage, was, on Thursday last, in the town of Tralee, attended by an exceedingly distressing circumstance. 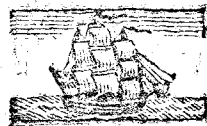
