GRENA-GREEN MARRIAGES.

The Lady who was tried for Bigamy at Surry Assizes had
 a very narrow escape, from the circumstance of her prosecu-
 tor not being prepared to prove the validity of Grenna
 Green marriages. The Scotch Court has determined, on a
 hundred occasions, that, without any ceremony whatever,
 the parties living and cohabiting as man and wife, and de-
 claring themselves such, is as binding as the most formal
 marriage, although it subjects them to penalties. They have
 held also, that a promise of marriage, with subsequent con-
 summation, is equivalent to marriage itself; nay, in a case
 about ten years ago, they decided, that the man having by
 letters and otherwise declared the woman his wife, made her
 so to all intents and purposes, though it was proved that the
 marriage was never consummated. In May, 1767, the validi-
 ty of Scotch marriages was determined by Dr. Hay in the
 Court of Arches. In that case a gentleman of fortune car-
 ried a young lady under age to Scotland, where they were
 married in a private house (it is not stated whether it was by
 a clergyman), but it was without a licence or proclamation
 of banns. The Judge was clearly of opinion that this was
 good in law, and that marriages in Scotland do not come
 within the Act of Parliament of 1754, to prevent clandestine
 marriages. This decision was afterwards confirmed by
 the Court of Delegates. We make these observations, the
 rather because we observe it has been improperly stated in
 several papers, that the case at Guildford settled the point
 that Grenna-Green marriages are not binding, whereas the
 lady was here acquitted solely for want of evidence of what
 is the law of Scotland.
