BOUNTY.

We think it highly necessary to give the following article the utmost publicity possible:—

The Widow of any Officer or Seaman slain in action with the enemy is entitled to his Majesty's gracious bounty, amounting to twelve month's pay, according to the rank they held; and if she has children, each child is entitled to one-third of a year's pay.

The Mother of any Officer or Seaman is entitled to the like bounty of twelve months' pay, provided she is above the age of 50 years, and that her son died unmarried.

The under-mentioned Certificates are required in the case of a Widow and Children, viz.

- 1st. Certificate of her Marriage.
- 2d. Certificate from the Minister and of the Parish in which she resides, testifying that she is a person of good repute, and a fit object of the King's bounty.
- 3d. Certificates of the Baptism of her Children.

In the case of a Mother.

- 1st. Certificate of her Baptism.
- 2d. Certificate of her Marriage.
- 4d. Certificate of her Son's Baptism.
- 4th. Certificate from the Minister and of the Parish in which she resides, testifying that she is a person of good repute, and a fit object of the King's bounty.

The above-mentioned Certificates are absolutely requisite, notwithstanding that similar Certificates may have been transmitted to the Pay Office when applications for the wages of a deceased seaman has been made. These Certificates to be transmitted under cover, to "the Treasurer or Paymaster of his Majesty's Navy, London," in order to be laid before the Navy Board; and if it appears to them that the person claiming the bounty is entitled thereto, a remittance bill for the amount will be made out in due course of business.

Trial

On Friday se'night, a Court of Revenue was opened in Derry, for the trial of the Revenue officers alleged to be committed against the Revenue in that District. The Sub-Commissioners were, W Moore, Thomas Gataker, and G. Black, Esqrs.—One of the principal trials was for acts of smuggling, alleged against the master or owners of the American ship Eliza, the seizure of which, by Captain Mitford, of the Nepean, we noticed some time ago. The trial commenced on Saturday the 11th, and was closed on the Monday following. The result was, that the ship and cargo have been forfeited to the captors—This cause excited much interest, as it is perhaps the only instance of an American ship being condemned for infringing on the laws of this country. The testimony of Captain Mitford as to the fact, was so clear and explicit, that no evidence was adduced on the part of the Defendants, and the judgment was pronounced accordingly.
