LIMERICK, NOVEMBER 7.

Yesterday morning a meeting took place at Somerville, near this city, between two Captains in the Army, when after firing a shot each, one of them received a mortal wound in the side, of which he yet lingers in the greatest agony; by particular request we omit stating the names of the parties. On their approaching Mr Hartoy's seat, he, most humanely, proceeded with all speed to town for a Magistrate to prevent this melancholy affair—but on his return the wounded Officer lay stretched on the field.

We are informed from the best authority, that Colonel Crosbie declines standing a Roll for the Election of the county Kerry. The Right Hon. Man. Fitzgerald, and Colonel Herbert, of Muckrus, are the only Candidates, consequently there will be no contest.

Wednesday morning, a carpenter named Kearney, employed in the Canal work, fell from a Lighter into the Canal and unfortunately perished.

On Wednesday last, the Chief Magistrate of this city held an Inquest on the body of a woman named *Whiteside*. When it appeared in evidence she received a stroke of a stone on the head some time since at one of the slips from Mary Considine, which caused her death. Verdict wilful murder against said Mary Considine.

“A letter from Donaghadee, dated Oct. 29, says a number of dead bodies have been seen floating down a channel during the late southerly gales, supposed to be of those persons who perished on board the packet, lost some time since. On the 25th inst. the body of a drowned man was washed on shore, about three miles to the southward of Portpatrick. He appeared to be middle aged, and without any clothes, except a pair of breeches and stockings, with only one shoe, the heel of which was drove full of nails. It is conjectured that he had been a labouring man from this country, and had been in England during the harvest, where he had saved six guineas, which was sewed up in the waistband of his breeches.”

The Priscilla, Blondett, from this Port, arrived at Waterford, the 9th September last.
