# RECRUITING SERVICE.

The following Instructions to Officers and other Persons, specially appointed to Recruit for the Infantry, have lately been issued.

### INSTRUCTIONS.

The following regulations have been approved by his Majesty, and are to be strictly observed, by all persons acting under the authority of his Royal Highness the Commander in Chief, in the extraordinary recruiting of the infantry:

Article 1.—They are to be confined to enlist men, within the limits specified in the authority given to them, under the hand of the Commander in Chief.

Art. 2.—The age, size, and description of the recruit, to conform to his Majesty's Regulations for recruiting the army.

Art. 3.—The Bounty to the Recruit, and the distribution thereof is to be according to the Statement annexed.

Art. 4.-Persons employed will not be entitled to any pay, but will receive the sum of five guineas to cover all charges and incidental expences for each recruit, in the proportion set forth in the annexed Schedule.

Art. 5 .- They are to conform to all orders issued from time to time, from the Commander in Chief, through the Inspector General, or Inspecting Field Officer of the district.
