Yesterday the Election commenced for return-
 ing two Knights of the Shire to represent this
 County in Parliament, when Proclamation being
 made, and his Majesty's Writ of Election to the
 High Sheriff, read, the following Gentlemen were
 proposed Candidates:—

William Odell, of the Grove, Esq.—by Bol-
 ton Waller, and seconded by De Courcy O'Grady,
 Esq.

The Hon. Windham Quin, of Adare—by Char-
 les Silver Oliver, Esq. late Representative, and
 seconded by the Hon. John Massy.

William Thomas Monsell, of Tervoe, Esq.—
 by Stephen Edward Rice, and seconded by Char-
 les Silver Oliver, Esq.

Most part of the day was taken up with en-
 deavouring to disqualify Mr. James Wall, as
 Clerk of the Peace, which was over-ruled. The
 High Sheriff and the Clerk of the Peace having

 ed, *pro forma*, and, after one being polled, ad-
 journed until 10 o'clock this morning.
