Our Commercial readers will hear with no ordinary gratification, that the West India Fleet which sailed from Cork, on the 14th of September, under Convoy of the Latona frigate, arrived safe at Barbadoes on the 25th of October,—all well. Miranda had arrived at that Island on the 29th of Oct. after an unsuccessful attempt on the Spanish Main—the failure of which he attributed, it is said to the inefficient co-operation of our West India Government.—He sailed again in the Circe frigate in which he had arrived—it was thought for Trinidad. The Circe, it appears from Lloyd's List, arrived in England on the 9th inst.—A letter from Barbadoes of the 3d inst. states that a small homeward bound fleet was to sail from thence in a day or two. The Packet which sailed from England on the 2d of September, it was apprehended, was captured. A French privateer, of 26 guns, having been seen 14 leagues to windward of the island, with a brig in tow and another in company.
