#### LEEWARD ISLAND FLEET.

The West India Fleet, which we stated on Fri-  
day to have passed this harbour, was the homeward  
bound Leeward Island Fleet. The Drakelt, An-  
clert, Master, has arrived in this harbour. She  
sailed from Tortola about two months since, with  
seventy six sail in company, under convoy of the  
Seine frigate, and Merlin sloop of war. They ex-  
perienced very severe weather on the voyage—and  
on the 29th ult. in lat. 43. N. long. 30. W. the  
Drakelt, parted company in a heavy gale of wind.  
There were at that time only twenty six sail with  
the convoy.
