**MARTIN V. QUINN.**

This case, which has so soon followed that of Cloncurry v. Piers, is with respect to it, what *High Life below Stairs* is to genteel comedy. Yet to us vice appears equally disgusting in either walk of life, nor can we think with a celebrated writer of our own country, "that it loses half its evil by losing all its grossness." This

Shews with the *great*, those high-born sons of pride,

The Plaintiff is a Publican, and the Defendant an Attorney. Their acquaintance commenced, not at school, as in the former case, but in the prison of the Four Courts' Marshalsea. Upon their enlargement, Martin opened a public house, which his friend Quinn constantly frequented, not in the vulgar character of a *customer* but as a *guest*. Determined however, to pay his hospitable entertainer in one coin or other, he commenced his addresses to his wife, and succeeded in his purposes almost as soon as the most fashionable rake could have done. He was however deficient in that sort of delicacy, which, it is to be supposed, is peculiar to high rank, and which, while it can reconcile to itself the debauching of a friend's wife, cannot endure the idea of separating her from her husband. Mr. Quinn solicited her to elope, and was as successful in this as he had been in every other request. The lovers having absconded, took refuge from the savage jealousy of poor Martin, in the polite purloins of Bull-alley, which, from its vicinity to the Courts, was considered peculiarly convenient by the Defendant as a place of relaxation from the severity of his legal avocations. But, as the Poet remarks,

The stream of true love never did run smooth,  
 the peaceful retreat of Bull-alley was violated by the intrusion of an irritated husband, who, at a most unreasonable hour of the night, burst into the apartment of ——— Quinn, whom he detected *nudam cum nuda*, a situation which we are happy to conceal under the *impenetrable veil* of a learned language. The defendant, true to the letter of his professional prerogative, was present there in Court in his own proper person, and acted as his Attorney. We apprehend, however, that in so doing he verified an observation made by a learned Judge, that the man who was his own lawyer had generally a *fool* for his *client*. His whole conduct in Court, where he ostentatiously displayed the fascinating beauty of his person, his unaffected impudence, and above all the defence set up by him, namely, the disparagement of the woman, whose only disgrace was her attachment to him, as was fully proved by the very testimony of his own witnesses, all concurred to rouse the indignation of the Jury, who, after an appropriate charge from the Bench, brought in a verdict of 2000l. damages, the full sum laid in the declaration.

Mr. Quinn had been arrested under a *fiat*, and was consequently in custody of the Marshal. Conceiving that he had finished his part *qualis ex incipio*, he attempted to make his *exit*, by darting into the King's Bench Chamber. He was again apprehended; but, strange to tell, upon being brought forth, he made another attempt, in which he was more fortunate, and escaped.

On Thursday night, however, Quinn was retaken, and no farther opportunity left to exercise either stratagem or agility.
