The evidence given by the above witnesses, was nearly conclusive of a criminal connexion between the parties; but their guilt was proved in the clearest manner by a young gentleman who was a tutor in the family, whose testimony, on his direct and cross-examination, we deem wholly unfit for the public eye.

Counsellor Joy made an ingentous speech for the defendant, in mitigation of damages.

Counsellor Scriven, spoke to evidence, for nopards of an hour, in an impressive and energetic myle; and declared that the utmost damages the Jury could give, was not an adequate punishment for the inherent vileness of the degraded defen-
