LIMERICK, APRIL 3.

On Saturday last, a duel took place near Tralee, between John Spotswood, Esq. of Valentia, and John Hayes, Esq. of Kenna, co. Kerry, when, after the former having received the fire of the latter, Mr S. discharged his pistol in the air, and of course a mutual reconciliation was the consequence.

The West India Fleet, consisting of sixty five vessels, sailed from Cove on Saturday last, under the convoy of his Majesty's ship Dædalus, and Dryad, as far as Madeira.

Last Monday night, the house of Mr. Walsh, Dublin, in Shannon-street, took fire, through the carelessness of a servant maid putting a candle not entirely extinguished, into the drawer of a press, which it consumed, with a part of the roof, &c.—it was burning for some time, the flames spreading rapidly, and communicating with the stairs, before discovered. Mr. and Mrs. Walsh were so frightened that they leaped from the window of the first floor into the street, and were both severely hurt:—when the alarm was given, several gentlemen of the neighbourhood attended, who broke in the doors and succeeded in getting it under.

Last Wednesday se'nnight, between the hours of five and six o'clock, in the evening, Edmond and Byran Hennessy, returning home from Kilkenny to Dama, were attacked near Killeen, by a party of men and women, and most barbarously beaten with bludgeons, stones, &c.—Edm. Hennessy received several wounds in the head, and a fracture in the skull, of which he died on Friday morning. An inquest was held on the body—verdict—that Edm. Hennessy came by his death by a blow of a stone on the head, given by Mich. Darcy, and a blow of a stick by E. Dwyer.

Saturday night, the remains of the much lamented Miss O'Grady, (whose death we inserted last Publication) daughter of the Right Hon. the Lord Chief Baron, arrived in town from Dublin, and on Sunday were interred in the family burial vault at Knoekany Church, in this county.
