Cork, April 8.—An atrocious attempt was made on Saturday night last, to assassinate Mr. Fitzgerald, of William-street, an honest and respectable citizen. A ball was fired through the window of his house, and in the direction where he generally sat; which, however, fortunately passed over his head, and lodged in the wall behind him; it also passed over the head of his son, who was sitting opposite to him. We wish we could ascribe this transaction to accident; but it too evidently appears the result of premeditated and malicious wickedness.

Friday the Mayor committed a man servant to bridewell for ten days, as a punishment for his having suddenly quitted the service of his Master, a respectable inhabitant of this city, without his Master's privity or consent, the term for which he engaged himself being unexpired.

Galway, April 2.—Yesterday, the Judges of Assize for the Connaught Circuit arrived in town, and opened their respective commissions in the town and county halls.—Justice Osborne got so much indisposed at Ballinrobe, as to prevent his proceeding on circuit to this town; his situation, for the present has been filled by the Solicitor General, Mr. Bushe.
