M. de Novozilzoff, who had been dispatched to the Prussian Court at Memel, with the answer of the Emperor, is said to have been charged to inform the French agent, that when their armies should have evacuated Germany, the proposals of the Emperor Napoleon would be listened to.”

The Orpheus frigate has been wrecked on the Coral Reef, near Jamaica, on the 23d of July, the Captain, Officers, and crew were saved.

Colonel Crawford had not arrived at La Plata, when the last accounts came off, but we have seen a letter which states, he was daily expected to call off that river on his way to Lima, whither it seems his expedition was destined.

DUBLIN—APRIL 18.

The London Gazette of Tuesday last, announces the capture of the French National corvette Lynx, of 16 guns and 181 men, by the boats of his Majesty's ship Galatea, on the coast of Caraccas. Lieut. Henry Walker was killed in the attack; Lieut. Coombe, who had before lost a leg, received a dangerous wound in the thigh, above the former amputation. There were nine seamen killed, and 22 wounded, on our side.—The French lost 14 in killed, and 20 were badly wounded.—The same Gazette also contains an account of the capture of the Spanish man of war schooner, Dolores, by the boats of the Orpheus; the Isabella Spanish schooner privateer, two four-pounders, and 64 men, by the sloop Hunter; and the sloop Favorite, late in his Majesty's service, by the Jason, on the coast of Guayana.

Mr. Deputy Birch's motion in a Court of Common Council of London, to address his Majesty, thanking him “ for his firmness and zeal in upholding the Protestant Reformed Religion, in asserting his Royal Prerogative, and maintaining the dignity of the Throne,” was carried by a majority of 74.

A Patent has passed the Great Seal, constituting and appointing Sir Frederick Flood, Bart. Custos Rotulorum for the county Wexford, in the room of the late Most Noble the Marquis of Ely.

Lord Donoughmore has resigned his situation as one of the Joint Postmasters General of Ireland; rumour has appointed many successors to his Lordship, but we believe, as yet, without any certainty.

This day a motion was made in the Court of King's Bench, for a conditional order to shew cause why a new trial should not be had in the case of Lord Cloncurry against Sir J. Piers, Counsel on behalf of the Defendant were heard in support of the motion, which, however, the Court refused, without hearing any of the Counsel on the other side.
