

The following Resolution of the Roman Catholic Body, was entered into last Saturday, at the Exhibition-Room, viz.

Resolved, that Lord Fingal be requested to wait upon his Grace the Duke of Bedford, and to express the gratitude which the Catholic Body feel for the mild and dignified conduct pursued by his Grace during his Administration in Ireland, towards every description of his Majesty's subjects, and their deep, sincere, and unfeigned regret at his Grace's intended departure from this country. Lord Fingal having waited on his Grace he was pleased to return the following Answer:

The Resolution which your Lordship has been pleased to convey to me as the sense of that great and loyal Body, the Roman Catholics of Ireland, claims my warmest acknowledgements.

In the discharge of the arduous trust committed to my hands by his Majesty, it has been my constant and earnest endeavour to promote the interests and prosperity of this part of the United Kingdom; and in now relinquishing that trust in obedience to his Majesty's commands, I retire to the less anxious cares of private life, cheered by a conscious feeling within me, that to the best of my judgment and abilities, I have done my duty to my Sovereign and to my country.

In whatever situation I may hereafter be placed, be assured, my Lord, that I shall never cease to entertain the most fervent wishes for the happiness of every class and description of my fellow subjects, in this part of the British Empire.

Tuesday one Joseph Lonergan, of Mullogh, a noted offender, was apprehended by Edmond Power, Esq. and brought by him, with the assistance of his son, to Clonmel gaol. Lonergan attempted both escape and resistance, and was shot in the thigh by Mr. Power, before he was made prisoner.

conceive of great importance to the public and essentially necessary to be made known to the labouring part of the community. By an Act of Parliament passed in the 45th year of his present Majesty's reign, entitled "An Act to prevent unlawful combinations of Workmen, Journeymen, Artificers, and Labourers, in Ireland; and for other purposes relating thereto," it is enacted, "that any person convicted before two Magistrates of being concerned in any combination or contract, for obtaining an advance of wages, altering the time of working, decreasing the time of working, &c. shall, for every such offence, be liable to be committed to Jail for any time not exceeding Six Calendar Months; or, at the discretion of such Justices, to be committed to the House of Correction, and kept to hard labour for any time not exceeding three calendar months."—Upon a charge of this nature, Michael Shea was accused on Wednesday last, and convicted before Wm. Arthur, and Jonas Studdert, Esqrs. who committed him to Jail for One Month.

Last Saturday morning, James Neal, labourer, laying the foundation of a house near Catherine-street, incautiously took away the props from the banks, when shortly after both sides fell in on him, and was nearly crushed to death:—he was instantly taken to the County Hospital, where every attention is used for his recovery.
