### DUBLIN—MAY 9.

Yesterday about the hour of three o'clock, a fire was discovered in the house of Mr. M'Donald, No. 5, William-street, Paper Manufacturer.—The flames raged with violence for some time, but were extinguished by the timely arrival of the fire engines, and the great exertions of the inhabitants of Wilton-street and others, the fire was got under.—We understand that the damage sustained was considerable.

Friday last, about five o'clock in the morning, James Johnson, a labourer, belonging to the Messrs. Jameson and Steise's Distillery, Bow-street, was found suffocated in the distillery, a neighbouring Clergyman being sent for, on examining the body, said the vital spark was extinct, and every person who beheld the man, even Mr. Rooney, sent for by the humane proprietors, he, however, used the usual means resorted to on such melancholy occasions for a considerable time without effect, and was on his departure, as a *dernier resort*, he ordered one of the servants to pour some boiling water on one of the poor man's legs, which was equally unsuccessful as the other means tried, but on the water being poured on the other leg, the poor man seemed to feel it, and was with the further assistance of medicine procured, perfectly restored to life and children.
