LIMERICK, JUNE 23.

We are authorised to state that the Lord Bishop of Limerick has altered his proposed route and will hold his annual Visitation in Tralee on Friday the 3d of next July, and that he will hold confirmations in his tour through the county of Kerry in the following Churches on the day mentioned:

At Kenmare on Sunday the 21st—At Cahir on Thursday the 25th—At Kilcoleman—Saturday 27th—At Kiltalla Sunday 28th—At Ballinacourty Monday 29th—At Tralee Friday 3d of July—At Castle-Island Saturday 4th July—At Listowell Sunday 5th—and at Kilnaclen Tuesday the 7th of July.
