Thunder Storm.

Thursday morning, between the hours of two and three, there occurred one of the most dreadful storms of thunder and lightning that we ever remember to have happened. During the preceding evening, the oppressive heat of the air, the lowering of the sky, and the livid colour of the clouds, gave signs that the atmosphere was strongly impregnated with the electrical fluid, which was still farther evinced by several flashes, particularly from the east, although the interval that elapsed between the gleam and the report, and the weakness of the latter, shewed that the distance was considerable. Towards morning, however, every symptom was aggravated, the vapours became more dense, the lightning more vivid, and the flashes more frequent and expansive. The bursts of thunder that followed these can be compared to nothing less than the repeated discharge of a vast train of battering artillery, which, with tremendous showers of rain, rendered for a long time the prospect of the heavens awfully terrific. We very much fear that the effects of this elemental conflict are not confined to the few accidents that were the consequence of it in this city. A ball of fire, after a long though rapid gliding through the air, fell on the promontory and in the neighbourhood of the town of Howth.—We have not heard of any person being hurt; windows were broken in several houses, and the chimney of a house in Church-street was much injured. Several horses and cows in the vicinity of Dublin have been killed by the lightning.

On Friday last, a cargo, being the fifth since the working of the copper-mine commenced near Skerries, was exported from thence to England, this is a circumstance which the public will feel a patriotic pride in contemplating.
