3 Limerick, Patrick-street, Sept. 4, 1807

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed in the Reign of his present Majesty, it was thereby enacted,—That no Person whatsoever should Fish in the River Shannon, between the 12th day of August and the 1st day of February, or carry on the Banks of said River any Instrument whatsoever, by which Salmon or any other kind of Fish may be taken (the Holders of the Lax Weir excepted).—And if any Person should offend herein, every such offender being thereof convicted, by confession or by the testimony of any one creditable witness, upon oath before some one Justice of the Peace for the County where such offence shall be committed, which oath such Justice of the Peace is hereby empowered and required to administer (under the penalty of 20l.) shall for every such offence forfeit the penalty of 5l. over and above the Instrument or Instruments made use of by such offenders; the same to be levied by the warrant of such Justice, by distress and sale of offenders goods, and to be paid to informer or informers.—And if no sufficient distress can be found, the offender shall by the like warrant be committed to the County Gaol, there to remain without bail or main-prize for three months, unless such forfeiture shall in the meantime be paid.

Now, we THOMAS and JOHN BURKE, by the power given to us, as holders of the Lax Weir, are determined to strictly enforce said recited Act, and will pay a further sum of two Guineas to any Person who will prosecute to conviction, any Person offending against said Act: and have appointed the following Persons and their assistants, to watch the River.
