His Majesty held a Privy Council, and gave private audiences to the Cabinet Ministers and Mr. Bond, who laid before his Majesty the proceedings of several Courts Martial.

Soon after five o'clock his Majesty set off on his return to Windsor.

At four o'clock yesterday afternoon, Mr. Kaye, the messenger, arrived at the Foreign Office, with dispatches from his Excellency Lord Granville Leveson Gower, our Ambassador at St. Petersburg. They were conceived to be so interesting in their nature, that after the Council at the Queen's House broke up, a Cabinet Council was, at eight o'clock, assembled at the Foreign Office, at which the greater part of the Members assisted.

Yesterday dispatches arrived at the Admiralty from Lord Collingwood. They contain an account of his cruize to the Levant, but the particulars had not transpired when this paper went to press. His Lordship, with four sail of the line, arrived at Malta on the 4th of October.—*Star*.

LIMERICK—NOVEMBER 17, 1807.

Yesterday morning, pursuant to orders issued the preceding day, the Limerick Volunteer Cavalry, commanded by Captain Wilkinson, and the Yeomen Infantry, of this city, assembled, fully accoutred, on Arthur's-Quay, and Custom-house yard, where they received their necessary instructions; they were then marched off in detachments, with a peace officer to each, and proceeded to different parts of the liberties, when they made a close search for fire arms, and returned in the evening, having got several musquets, fouling-pieces, pistols, swords, &c.

Captain Wilkinson, this morning, delivered up to General Michell, commanding this district, 20 stand of arms, taken by his corps of cavalry, in the neighbourhood of Castleconnell, Killoonan, &c.

In consequence of the Edict (which appears in the preceding column) on the part of the Court of Portugal, George Maunsell, Esq. Collector of the Customs of this Port, has detained, last night, the Portuguese Schooner St. Antonio De Fiete, and this day her crew were taken out and committed to prison.

The Danish sailors, for some time on their parole in this city, were also committed to prison.

Yesterday the last division of the Carlow regiment of militia, marched in here from Fermoy, and this morning proceeded on their route for Birr.

Gen. Whitelocke was on Monday last put under arrest previous to his being tried by a Court Martial upon seventeen charges preferred against him by Sir Samuel Achmuty.—*Correspondent*.

Last Wednesday a heavy cart rolled over the head of a drunken man, near Leitrim-Bridge, by which shocking accident the bones of his face were crushed in pieces, and one of his eyes totally obliterated.

Surveyor of Excise, and a party of those Dragoons, proceeded on Thursday last about ten miles from this town, where they detected two extensive private distilleries, in the middle of the day, in which they found twenty-one vessels full of Potale and Singlings, and one of the Stills at full work. After destroying the whole of the utensils, and spilling the Potale and Singlings, the party returned here in the evening, and lodged the seizures in his Majesty's stores.
