SOUTH, MARCH 23.—Letters from Falmouth announce arrival there of a very rich French East India Company, from L'Isle de France for L'Orient, by the *Cossack*, Captain Digby. Arrived the ship *Le Serpent*, Captain Dupont, from Bayonne Guadeloupe, with stores, flour, and provisions, for the Earl Spencer Post Office packet; and the brig *Caroline*, of 4 guns, and 30 men, Captain from Bayonne, with brandy, wine, and fruit, for the *Amethyst*, 38, Captain Seymour. The French schooner *L'Adventura*, from Bourdeaux Guadeloupe, of two guns and 10 men, with flour, prize to the *Emerald* frigate, 36, Captain. The above two frigates were left in chase of prizes then in sight; the *Amethyst* was up firing at a large brig. Three P. M. the *Amethyst*, Capt. Seymour, has just sent in a ship pierced for from Bourdeaux to the Isle of France, with a cargo. The *Emerald* in sight. Arrived the *Citoyenne* sloop of war from a cruise.
