COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.

BERNARD & HACKET v. BROWNE.

The Court was occupied the greater part of last week in hearing Serjeants Moore and Ball against a conditional order to set aside the Verdict obtained by the Plaintiffs in the Sitting last Term before Lord Norbury and a Special Jury; when the Court unanimously confirmed the rule, setting aside the Verdict.

From the magnitude of this question to the commercial world, the Court explained the law in the clearest manner, observing any charge of Commission exceeding 6 per cent. on the discount of Bills was Usury; but that imposing Drafts or Promissary Notes having any time to run, as Cash in payment of discounts, was monstrous usury. Thus these oppressive charges, so long imposed on the public, are at length put down, and the law upheld in opposition to the custom of the Country Bankers.

Limerick, May 20.

The Common Council of this City, on Wednesday last, agreed with John Meade, Thomas, Esq. to become tenants to a Main-guard House, to be built by him on George's-quay, and ready for the reception of the Military on the 1st of January next.

Monday last, Patrick Neville, of Deagh-castle, was murdered near Stonehall, in this county, by a number of persons who were engaged in a riot at the Fair held there on that day;—information being given to Edward Villiers Fitzgerald, Esq. he apprehended Bridget Shaughnessy, who is charged with being concerned, and who he lodged in jail on Thursday.

Tuesday, the Hon. Colonel Burton passed through Ennis, from the head-quarters of his regt. (the Clare militia) at Boyle, on his return to his seat at Buncraggy.

Lieut. Gen. Floyd, on his route from Cork to Dublin, when passing through Kilkenny on Monday last, reviewed the troops in that garrison.

Thursday last, the detached parties of the 7th Dragoon Guards, stationed at Gort, Tralee, Listowel, Bruff, Hospital, Croom, Ennis, and Eanistimon, arrived in this garrison, and this morning proceeded on their route for Dublin.—They are to be replaced by detachments from the 1st German Dragoons, which regiment arrived here on Thursday, yesterday, and this day.

The 19th Light Dragoons, at present quartered in Norwich, are ordered to this country.
