Morris, Esq. of Tralee, his second son, a beautiful and interesting child, 4 years old, by accident was unfortunately pushed towards the pot, into which he fell, and immediately to relate, he was so burnt outwardly and inwardly, that he continued in torture till the next evening, when kind nature ended his sufferings with his life.
