Limerick, July 1.

The Lord High Chancellor, has been pleased to appoint the Rev. Richard Kennedy, Prebendary of Clondra, to be a Magistrate of the County Clare.

The entire of the 19th Light Dragoons, arrived on Thursday in Dublin, from England—the first division have searched for country cantonments.

The Tyrone Militia has arrived in Dublin.

A trial, possessing very considerable public interest, was heard in the Recorder's Court, Cork, on Monday last. The Prosecutor was a Mr. Lyons, of South Main-street, and the Traverser Mr. Abraham Donovan Fitzpatrick, a Collector of Hearth and Window Tax. The charge was for extortion, under the sanction of his Office by levying a tax amounting to £1 10s. 5d. upon a window light, which did not come within the operation of the Act subjecting window light to taxation; and which Act he, according to the construction of the indictment, he was violating. There were also other counts in the indictment, in substantiation of the charge of extortion. The charges being fully proved, the Jury returned, and after some time brought in a Verdict of Guilty. The Traverser was accordingly placed at the Bar, and the Recorder, after addressing him in a few words, sentenced him to pay a fine of Fifty Pounds.

We are assured, that one of the murderers of the late Mr. Power, of Benvoy, Co. Waterford, is in actual custody in Carrick. He is said to have been identified by Mr. James Power, eldest son of the deceased, who was present at the commission of the horrid crime.

Yesterday, was transmitted from Tipperary, to our Gaol, by a warrant from Richard Sadleir, Esq; by whom they were apprehended, Darby Lynch and John Martin, charged with having on the 9th of January last, robbed on Mr. Chute, of Bawnora, Co. Kerry, a £20 Bank Note, which had been robbed out of the Mail.
