

MERRICK CHRONICLE—WATSON AND MAHONY PROPRIETORS.

*Limerick, July 8.*

High Chancellor has been pleased to appoint General John Moore, M<sup>r</sup>. Matthew Moore, C<sup>lerk</sup>, W<sup>m</sup>. Watson, and John Massey, Jun<sup>r</sup>, Esq<sup>s</sup>, to be Justice for the County of Limerick.

She was spoken with off Cape Clear, on her way to England from Sicily, charged with the British Government.
