On Saturday, at four o'clock the Inquest terminated, and was holden by the Right Worshipful John Crips, Mayor, as Coroner, on the body of John Lillis, a man, mentioned in our last Chronicle, when the returned the following Verdict:—"That the said John Lillis was on the 7th day of July inst. found dead on the shore in the County of Limerick side of the River Shannon, with marks of violence on his eye and mouth, scratches on his breast—and we find that the said John Lillis came to his death by drowning, but we are not informed whether his death happened by accident, or wilful violence done on him."

On Sunday last, between the hours of 12 and 1 o'clock in the day, three armed men approached the house of the J. Blunden, of Annfield, in the County Kilkenny; perceiving them, supposing that they were police men, advanced and asked their business—they demanded arms—Mr. Blunden replied, "Wait my boys, I will give them to you immediately," and ran towards the door, with the intention of defending it. Two of them immediately fired—fortunately one of the guns, which had just taken from Mr. H. Blackmore's, was only discharged with shot—which slightly wounded him, from the neck down to his heel, for being at some distance from him when they fired, the skin was only punctured—the gardener, who was standing by him, felt the ball of the ball which was fired from the other musket.
