At the Assizes of Carlow on Wednesday last, Mrs.
Ann Ryan, of Barnhill, a widow lady of property and
respectability, was convicted for keeping an unlicensed
still, and received sentence to be imprisoned for one year
and to pay a fine to the King of One Hundred Pounds.
Mr. Justice Daly animadverted on the alarming height
this offence had arisen to in several Counties, and the
heavy burdens that were necessarily obliged to be inflict-
ed on the inhabitants, & said that it was requisite that a
public example should be made, from which neither the
prisoner's property, nor her rank in life would protect her.

Thomas Stuart, Esq. whose diligence to improve the
approaches to this City, from the Co. Clare, has been so
conspicuous, was, at the last Assizes, appointed Conserv-
ator of all the roads and public works in the Liberties
of this City.

On Sunday evening, Mr. Wm. Dwyer, of this City,
Linen Inspector, was attacked in a most wanton manner
by a number of fellows, on the road near Rocktown,
in this county:—they beat him cruelly, so that when a
neighbouring magistrate was called, he was unable to
give information.—Mr. Dwyer was kindly received into
the house of Mr. Barry, of Rocktown, where surgic-
al aid was obtained.

A most distressing event occurred yesterday to a fine
boy, three years old, son of Mr. Robert O'Shaughnessy,
George's-street:—happening to go into the kitchen, he
fell into a pot of boiling water, and the poor innocent
was so dreadfully scalded, that it survived but 5 hours.

Thursday last, the house of Mr. John Studdert, of
Kilfin, Co. Kerry, was maliciously set on fire, and to-
gether with his furniture therein was entirely consumed.
This Gentleman, together with all his family, had pre-
viously retired for safety to Tralee, as mentioned in a
former publication.

Same day an unlicensed still, seized by Arthur Chute,
Esq. near Killorglin, Co. Kerry, was brought to Tralee,
and lodged in the Custom-House.

We understand, that by an Act of the last Session, all
forfeited Recognizances to the 1st July, 1806, are erased
from the Rolls in the Pipe Office.

Three hundred and twenty men are to be provided
for the County Limerick Militia, and 900 for the City
Limerick, under the late Act, which authorizes a bounty,
not exceeding eight guineas, for each volunteer who
may be enrolled, including the marching guinea; but
there is a further allowance by Government of one guinea
each man, to the Colonel, to defray the necessary ex-
pences, in procuring and enrolling the Volunteers, who
are not to be less than 5 feet 2 inches in height, and not
more than 45 years of age.
