*The following Letter was received last Night, by the
 Rt. Worshipful John Grips, Esq. Mayor, from London.*

"It is respectfully suggested to the Worshipful the
 Mayor and Corporation of Limerick, that on the 26th
 of October, His Majesty enters the Fiftieth Year of his
 Reign—that so remarkable an epoch has not occurred
 since the Reign of Edward III. and only twice within
 1200 years;—that it is therefore proposed to commemo-
 rate the day by a Jubilee, in which it is hoped the res-
 pectable inhabitants of Limerick will readily and zeal-
 ously concur in promoting such festivities as may be
 most generally agreeable."
