Saturday last, John Evans, Esq. a Magistrate for the Counties of Tipperary and Limerick, summoned Thos. Ryan, Blacksmith, of Foyleduff, Co. Tipperary, for not producing a License, pursuant to the Arms Act, & committed him to Nenagh Goal, until he pays the fine of £10—the bellows and anvil of said Blacksmith were sent into the stores at Nenagh.

At the Races of Tralee, on Thursday, a Handicap of 5gs. each, and 25gs. from the Steward, was run for by four horses, and is yet undetermined, each owner claiming the plate.

Friday's Plate of 30gs. for beaten horses was won by Mr. Robert Swiss's horse Iris.

Saturday last, two children playing near a window of the Attic Story, in a house back of Nicholas-Street, fell from thence and both are so much bruised, that they are despaired of.

Sunday night, at 11 o'clock, a man in company with a Cyprian, on the Long Dock, fell into the river, and would have been drowned, but for the prompt exertions of the crew of a vessel who risked their lives for his preservation.—Another man, who was also in imminent danger, having sunk thrice, in the dock adjoining the Custom-house, was saved by the same humane sailors.

Yesterday the Benevolent Society rewarded Patrick Vaughan, Rose Carthy, James Galvin, and William Denny, for saving from drowning, John Cummins, Mary O'Brien, and Elenor Molony.—It appears that this last mentioned person (a very young woman) threw herself deliberately into the river, with the resolution of drowning herself.

The Lord Lieutenant and Council, by a Proclamation of the 26th ult. have ordered that a ballot do take place in the counties of Down and Mayo, in consequence of representations from the Governors of those counties to raise an additional two fifths of militia men to their respective regiments.—The Proclamation shall appear in our next.

Yesterday morning the remains of that much beloved and ever to be respected Augustine Fitz-Gerald, Esq. were conveyed from the house of his only surviving brother, Major Fitz-Gerald, in Thomas-street, for interment in the family vault in Kilnashula Church, Co. Clare:—a multitude of honest peasants, whose hearts glowed with gratitude for their dear deceased benefactor, hastened from a very distant part of the Co. Clare, to bear his honored corpse; and from this City, a vast train of carriages and horses conveyed a number of most respectable Citizens, (double the number would have attended, had not the appointed time been altered)—the solemn procession was met on every road by his Right Hon. and Honorable Friends—his respectable Relatives—numerous Neighbours and Tenantry, who, while the Clergyman "committed his body to the earth, in sure and certain hope of the Resurrection to Eternal Life," could not depart without repeating, in the words of an elegant Poet,

"This man was happy—had the world's good word,
"And with it, ev'ry joy it can afford;
"Friendship and Love seem'd tenderly at strife,
"Which most should sweeten his much valued Life."

The remains of Captain and Adjutant Ward of the Waterford Regiment, (whose death we inserted in the Major part of our last impression) were interred on Sunday last with military honors in St. John's. He was an Officer esteemed by the Corps, and his death much lamented.
