 George Sutherland, of the 71st regiment.—On Sunday
 last, in Cork, Sylvester Moriarty, Esq. Vice Adm. of
 the White—he commanded the Ramillies in 1782, un-
 der Adm. Graves, on his return from the West Indies,
 when the Ville de Paris was lost, and had the Ramillies
 so disabled in consequence of the storm, and her guns
