

Limerick, Feb. 4.

Letter has been received by Mr. Wm. Alley, of this City, from his brother-in-law, Lieut. Henry Leake, of the 50th Regt. Jun arrived at Plymouth, from the 50th Regt. and a native of this place, who was in the battle at Corunna—he was a young man of mild and engaging manners, and who distinguished himself in his Country's cause.

Extract a Letter from Captain Cameron, of the ship Thistle on her passage from Leith to Dublin, dated Portree, 2 of Skye, 11th inst. to a friend in Leith, transmitted Messrs. Crilly & Bindon of this city, to whom the vessel belongs:—

On Saturday the 7th we set sail from Leith, and on the 8th inst. at 10 a. m. 25 miles N. E. from the Cape we observed a vessel to leeward, carrying a press of sail to come up with us. At one p. m. we observed the vessel's privateer, and accordingly set all the sails close to our bows. At five p. m. the privateer was close to our bows, and did not all the time.

That of 66th regt. marched on Saturday, on its route to Middleton. On the 30th inst. the 30th regiment marched from Dublin; they are to be replaced by the 1st from Sligo.
