"Whereas it is necessary for the benefit of the Poor, to prevent exactions upon the sale of Salt in this kingdom, and to have the Rates and Prices thereof ascertained—Be it therefore enacted, that from and after the 1st June, 1797, the Justices of the Peace at the respective Quarter Sessions, shall set, ascertain, and duly publish
