

53. THE ARMY—The Battalion of the Scots Royals, commanded by Col. Raikes, which sailed some days ago, has been put back by contrary winds, and now remains at Spithead with the Foot Guards; a detachment of 300 men of the 3d bat. 95th, 200 of 2d bat. of same regt. and a detachment of 80 men from the 1st regt. going out to Cadiz, to join Gen. Graham's army. On Saturday 108 horses, for the waggon train, were shipped for the same place.

Tuesday another detachment of the 95th embarked for Portsmouth, and in the afternoon all the transports dropped down. Same day Gen. Dilkes, of the Guards, arrived with his suite; and the next day the General, as well as Generals Leith and Cameron, were to embark, and if the wind was favourable the fleet would sail. The Expedition consists of—Artillery and Artificers; the Scots Royals; a brigade of Foot Guards; the 3d Light Dragoons—and Rifle Corps, four companies.—The 9th and 82d regiments have already passed. Uncommon exertions have been made by Sir Roger Curtis and General Whetham to fit out this expedition.

The Welch Fusiliers at Lewes, are under orders for Guernsey, and the 16th Infantry, at Steyning, for Gibraltar.—Lieut.-Gen. Sir Stapleton Cotton returns to his command of the army in Spain.

A reduction of the Home Staff will immediately take place. All Officers holding Regimental Commissions with Staff appointments, are to be put on half-pay: and in future no Officer will be allowed to be on the latter whilst on full pay of the former.

The 13th Light Dragoons, 1st Foot, and 82d regts. sailed from Portsmouth on Monday, for Lisbon, with the trade for Portugal and the Mediterranean.

We are glad to observe, that in the new Code of Medical Regulations, justice is done to that most scientific class of officers, the Physicians to the Army, to whom the door is now open for promotion, the same as to the other class of officers.

It being now decided that Sir Harry Burrard does not go on service. Col. Dilkes is to command the brigade of Guards, which go to Cadiz, with the rank of Brigadier General. Dr. Shaw, of Brighton, goes out as Physician to the army in Cadiz.

Rio Janeiro, Jan. 16—Preparations are making for the reception of 5000 troops and a large naval force, under the command of Sir Sidney Smith, which is expected to arrive shortly, as a special request to that effect has been made by the Prince Regent. We have had no arrivals from the River Plata since the 15th October and of course can furnish you with no news from thence. Trade is at a stand from the great glut of produce here. The Elizabeth man of war sailed on the 15th inst. for London.

A letter of yesterday's date from the Constantia transport lying at the Mother Bank says, "The Horatia frigate has just arrived off the Needles with a prize, also a French frigate which she captured off Brest, after an action of an hour and twenty minutes; the French frigate is laden with naval stores, and has on board 100,000 dollars; she was bound to the Isle of France.

By the last Madras papers it appears that the forces of Dowlut Rao Scindia were in motion against the principality of Ajmere. Much plundering had taken place, and the fort of Gurrehind was shortly expected to surrender. There were no late accounts from Holkar; but Meer Khan, was at Bopaltal.

We have to state the capture of Bowannie in the Hurrianah country. The origin of these hostilities is ascribed to an act of aggression committed by the freebooters of Bowannie, on the baggage of a British detachment; and the refusal of reparation, in insolent and hostile terms, rendered an expedition necessary, for the maintenance of the British name, and the establishment of security in the long track of dependent territory, between the Jumna and the Sutledge." A detachment was sent, under Lieut.-Col. Ball, who attacked the town on the 29th of August, and took it by storm.

The entire loss of the enemy is estimated at from 600 to 1000 men; the loss on the part of the Company's troops in killed and wounded did not exceed 100, and of those the killed formed but a small proportion. Lieut. Stephen O'Brien was among the killed; among the

The Rev. A. Mac-Culloch has given Watson and Mahony, Five Pounds, sterling, a fine inflicted by Wm. Bouchier, Esq. on Dennis Halvey, for cutting timber on the land of Cahircorney, the property of Ed. Croker, Esq. to be applied half for the Protestant Female Orphan School, and the remainder to the Co. Infirmary.

The Treasurer of the House of Industry and hospital for Lunatics received yesterday, two guineas from Thos. Davenport, Esq. Foreman on two Co. Record Juries;—he also handed one guinea to Charles Creed, Esq. for a charitable purpose.

The operation of Lithotomy has been lately performed in this City, by Surgeon Thwaites, in presence of Doctors Grogan and Reardon, on two patients;—one a woman of the name of Myers, from the County of Limerick—the other John Gleeson, in the employment of John Gabbett, Esq. both, we are happy to hear, are doing well;—these are the first instances (we believe) of this formidable operation having been undergone here, whence it may be inferred that the necessity for it seldom occurs, and it is a singular circumstance, that in both the above cases it had arisen from the ineffectual treatment of Country Practitioners.
