MESSAGE TO FERDINAND VII.

A desperate riot and affray took place in the town of Thurles, on Thursday se'night, between the Caravats and Shanavests, when Mich. Delany, the leader of the latter faction, was taken up, and instantly tried before George Smyth, Esq. Assistant Barrister, who was then holding the Sessions. He was sentenced to be confined six months, and to be publicly whipped, which part of his sentence was immediately put in execution, so that the violation of the law was instantly marked by the punishment of the offender.

On Thursday last, a number of men, supposed about 500, were (by appointment since Easter Monday last) to have met at the Fair of Rosmanaher, Co. Clare, to have a pitched battle, and commit other depredations:—The clans were the M'Inernys, Cougha, and Costellows; but an Officer and 80 men of the 1st German Dragoons, accompanied by Mr. Cantrell, H. Constable of that Co. attended at D'Estarre's Bridge, which Mich. D'Alton, Esq. a Magistrate, took the command of, assisted by a party of the Kilkishen Cavalry, & proceeded to Six-mile-bridge, in said Co. where above 200 were collecting from O'Brien's Bridge, Trough, and other places, and who intended to go to the Fair to fight, when the above Magistrate apprehended Roger Costellow, the ringleader; and only that the party had dispersed on seeing the military at some distance, he would also have secured several others disposed to disturb the peace. Mr. D'Alton soon returned back to the Fair, with Costellow his prisoner, and went to a place, where he got information that M'Inerny and his party were, and apprehended the leader—he then sent the two Chiefs, tied in a car, to Ennis jail, under a military detachment—Mr. D'Alton proceeded again to the Fair-place, at five o'clock in the evening, and had all the tents struck, and the Green cleared.

The Mail Bag which had been robbed on Wednesday se'night, from this City to Ennis, was found near Clare, by Mr. Vandelaar and Mr. Hickey, on Wednesday last, who had it taken to the Post-Office of Ennis.—The Seals of the letters were all broken.

A few nights since, a house on the lands of Ballygrenan, Co. Kerry, was maliciously set fire to & consumed.

An Inquest was yesterday held at Bird-Hill, County Tipperary, before Richard Going, Robert Going and John Evans, Esq. Magistrates, on the body of Patrick Gorman, who was attacked when returning home from the Fair of Mont Pelier, on the evening of Tuesday last, and beat in such a manner as to cause his death.—The Jury returned a verdict of Wilful Murder against Malachy Ryan and others;—an Advertisement from the brother of the deceased is in this day's Chronicle.

The Treasurer of the Co. Infirmary has received from the Rev. Andrew Mac Cullogh, £2 10s. a mitigated fine inflicted by Wm. Bouchier, Esq. a Magistrate of this County, on Daniel Kean, for having timber in his possession, which was cut and stolen from the Lands of Cahircorney.
