A PROCLAMATION.
RICHMOND, &c.
WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament passed on
 June, in the 49th year of his present Majesty
 then an Act for completing the Militia, and
 amongst other things enacted, that the men need
 for the purposes of the said Act shall and may be
 several counties, and counties of cities and towns
 Ireland, by the enrolling and receiving of names
 rected by an Act passed in the 49th year of his
 reign, entitled, "an Act for empowering his Majesty
 augmentation of his Militia forces in Ireland."
 And it is thereby also further enacted, that it
 lawful for the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Go-
 vernors of Ireland for the time being, at any time af-
 ter the said Act, and during the said twelve months,
 to the Lord Lieutenant or other Chief Governor
 Ireland to be necessary for the more speedy com-
 Militia, to order and direct by any order or pro-
 ceed for that purpose by the Lord Lieutenant
 Governor or Governors, by and with the advice
 Privy Council in Ireland, that the Men required to

 county, be returned by Ballot.
 And whereas it appears to Us that it will be
 more speedy completing of the said Militia
