The body of Joseph Gash, an aged Huntsman, well known to many of the Gentlemen of this County, was at an early hour on Sunday morning last found murdered near the Race-Ground at Lemonfield;—the perpetrators are totally unknown, suspicion not attaching to any individual, and the man was considered very inoffensive:—we hear that a verdict of wilful murder has been declared by the Jury at the Coroner's Inquest.

On Sunday last, an Inquest was held on the body of Michael Dillon, hatter, of Millford, near Milltown-Malbay, County Clare, before Michael D'Alton, Esq. a Magistrate for that County, and Andrew Perry, Esq. one of the Coroners, when the Jury returned a verdict of wilful murder against Catherine Farrell, otherwise Dillon, who has absconded. The deceased has left a wife and six helpless children in the greatest distress.

About nine o'clock, on Sunday morning, two family factions, Kerby's, and Allen's, collected to the amount of some hundreds, near Longmore, for the purpose of deciding their disputes, and notwithstanding the activity and remonstrances of Richard Wilson, Esq. of Ballinacurra, one of the High Constables of this City, proceeded to blows, by which one man who has lodged information was dangerously cut, and were it not for the promptitude manifested by the above Peace Officer, and the threat of the military things would have been serious. The Allens' had the audacity to get across the Shannon from the County Clare side, to commence the contest; but we are assured, that if such conduct should be attempted in future, most striking examples will be made of such outrageous disputants, by the Magistrates for the different bailiwicks.

Some rioting took place on the night of Thursday last, between the Shanavests and Caravats, at the fair of Windygap, Co. Tipperary, and Major Prendergast, having brought to the place a party of the German Legion, took into custody one fellow named William Ryan, the most atrocious of the offenders.

Thursday last, the Rev. Nicholas Neilan, committed to Tralee Jail, Timothy and Denis Connor, and Rich. Geary, charged with being Whiteboys, and attacking the house of Darby Shea, of Moieuna, by firing two shots through his door, and threatening to burn his house, unless he and his family quitted the country.

The house of Thomas Sullivan, of Knockbawn, near Irremore, Co. Kerry, was set fire to by Whiteboys, and totally consumed. The poor man, his wife and eight children, narrowly escaped being burned to death in the conflagration, and every article in the house was consumed. Same night, the house of Maurice Trant, on the said lands was also set on fire; but by timely exertion it was fortunately got under without injury.

Melancholy Accident by Fire!—Thursday night last, about 12 o'clock, the house of Mr. Martin Fahey, inn-keeper, in Castleblaney, County Monaghan, was discovered to be on fire. It is supposed to have commenced in the cellar, as at the time of its discovery, the whole house was one universal blaze. Every possible exertion was made by the inhabitants, but alas! in vain, to save the unfortunate family, seven of whom were consumed to ashes! not one having escaped but Mr. Fahey himself, in his shirt and night-cap. Among the sufferers are his wife, who, it is supposed, perished in a vain attempt to save her children, two servant maids, and two privates of the 1st Dragoon Guards. The whole of Mr. Fahey's property, which was considerable, was consumed to ashes, and has left him, who was the day before in comfortable circumstances, literally a beggar.
