The Royal Longford Militia, quartered in Roscrea,

The Right Worshipful Francis Lloyds, Esq. Mayor,
commented his useful operations this week, by going
on Monday morning to Merchants' Quay, where hux-
ters were in the act of forestalling herrings, for which
they insisted on the exorbitant price of two pence half-
penny and three-pence each;—he caused the inhabi-
tants to get them at a penny a piece from the boatmen,
with which rate (being 10s. per hundred) the owners
were well satisfied, and the public was thus relieved
from paying such an excess, as would in fact tend to
prevent the poorer description of persons from enjoying
the blessings of plenty derived from aquatic supplies.

Two of the most notorious regraters of herrings were,
for one hour, exhibited in the Stocks, at the Exchange
on Monday last—and the Mayor sent three hundred of
the herrings which he seized, to the objects in the House
of Industry.

Monday night, the Watch of St. Michael's, appre-
hended ten of the frail Sex, nine of whom were com-
mitted to prison;—the Mayor had them yesterday con-
veyed to the House of Industry, in carts, where they
are placed to hard labour.—Mr. Henry Denmead, Con-
stable of the Watch has been very active.

A melancholy proof is daily exhibited in this populous
City, by the late Act allowing free use of Distillation—
for one wretch found at an early hour reeling through
the streets drunk a few months ago—hundreds, both
male and female, are now daily seen, more as beasts
than rational creatures; and though they cannot afford
to purchase a stone of potatoes, yet a few half-pence
are found to bring to their lips two or three glasses of
whiskey!—Hence the cause why our breweries are
nearly at a stand, and scarcely afford as much harm as
supplies the bakers to carry on their useful trade!!!
