Sir Joseph Yorke arrived in town yesterday, but brought no additional news. He states, we hear, that Massena broke up on the 6th instant in the evening, and that Lord Wellington commenced his pursuit on the morning of the 7th. It was reported on the 9th, and believed that our advanced guard had entered Thomar.

We are happy to learn that the troops which Sir Joseph Yorke took out were landed all in good health and spirits. A cutter was left behind to bring Lord Wellington's dispatches.

Last night we received *Moniteurs* and minor Paris journals to the 17th inst. Their contents are unimportant. There is no news from the Peninsula.

On Saturday evening last Tralee assizes ended, when the following persons were tried, found guilty and sentenced:—Darby Ryan, for having in his possession a forged Bank of Ireland Note, to be transported for 14 years. John Walsh, for uttering base coin, to be imprisoned six months. Timothy Collins, for cow-stealing, to be transported for life. Dennis Collins and Robert Fitzgerald, for a burglary and felony in the house of Charles M'Carthy—the former to be executed on the 13th, and the latter on the 20th of April. John White, John Gallivan, and Wm. Casey, for a burglary and felony in the house of Wm. Roche—the former to be hanged on the 13th, and the two latter on the 20th of April. Patrick Carrol, (soldier in the Leitrim Militia) guilty of manslaughter, to be confined twelve months and to give security. Thomas Greany, for assembling with others as a white boy at Beenleirim—to be imprisoned twelve months, and publicly whipped. Andrew Murphy, presented as a vagabond, to be transported for seven years. Cornelius Sullivan, Darby Driscoll, Darby Sullivan (suons) and Darby Sullivan (keagh) for obstructing Richard Day, Esq. Sub-Sheriff, in executing a writ in the Island of Sharky—the three latter to be imprisoned six months, and the former to give bail.

On Saturday morning last, Lord James O'Bryen, proceeded from this city for Dublin.

The object of the amendments made by the Committee in the Arrest Bill, is to extend the provisions of the Act of 1803, so that no person shall be arrested for a sum which did not originally amount to £20 exclusive of costs, charges, and expences incurred in suing for the same, except on bills of exchange or promissory notes.

In Waterford Maurice Brien, Thomas Kearney, Michael Farrell, and Robt. Magrath, found guilty of the murder of Timothy Collins, and of Mary Collins, his daughter, at Ballygarson, on the 24th of June last, were executed pursuant to their sentence.
