He has left a large family to lament his loss.

Brigade Major Crawford received the Lord Lieutenant's positive instructions to dismuss from the Roll of the Neale infantry those men who, upon one occasion (as appeared on a trial at the last assizes of this County personated threshers at night, in order to quiz some of their brethren of the corps.—Waterford Mirror.
