An infant male child was a few morning since, found dead, quite close to the Quay-wall, Galway, at low water. He had upon his neck a handkerchief squeezed very tightly, which favoured the supposition that he was murdered and exposed by his abominable parent. A Coroner's Jury returned a verdict of wilful murder, against some persons unknown.

His Royal Highness

WHEREAS by an Act of the year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, for regulating the Trade for regulating the Trade of His Majesty's Colonies and in the West India Islands and in the West India Islands and in the United States of America His Majesty's said subjects, and West Indies: It is, among other things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for His Majesty, by order or orders to be made in that behalf, from time to time, to authorize under his Sign Manual, the Governor of Newfoundland for the time being, in case of necessity, the importation of Bread, Flour, Indian Corn, and other provisions of the territories belonging to the Crown, for the supply of the inhabitants of Newfoundland, for the time being, provided always that such provisions shall not be taken from the live stock, so authorized to be imported, nor shall be specified in such orders, and in British built ships or vessels, and navigated according to the Acts in that behalf made.

Whereas it is expedient that the said provisions should be made for fully supplying the said territories, and for the season with bread, flour, pitch, tar, and other provisions, His Majesty the Prince Regent, in His Majesty's name and on the behalf of His Majesty, doth hereby declare, That for the satisfaction of the said territories, and for the supply of the inhabitants of Newfoundland, and also pitch, tar, and other provisions, to be imported into the said United Kingdom, and in British built ships, or vessels, and navigated according to the Acts in that behalf made, in the space of nine months, such importation have clear the United Kingdom of Great Britain, and other His Majesty's dominions, and for the purpose a licence shall have been granted to any person or persons who may be named in the said licence, in the said territories, which licence shall be in force for nine calendar months, and no longer; provided that the said licence shall be granted after the thirtieth day of April next, and shall be of any force or effect, unless it is hereby further pleased to be otherwise ordered by His Majesty, and His Majesty's privy council.
