CATHOLIC MEETINGS.

At every public meeting recently held in Ireland the catholics had a decided protestant support but that to which we would here particularly advert, in the Cork meeting, where the Rev. Dr. Austen, a Rector of the established church; advocated the claims of his catholic countrymen, declaring this incontrovertable truth, "that the prospectly of the empire is identified with their liberation from all restrictions that place them in a worse condition than their protestant fellow subjects." When the Rev. Doctor stood forward to address the meeting, he was haded by an inoversal plaudit, which was followed by cheering and the waving of hats. In the midse of the noise many voices were heard even good * God bless him."

The following letter, annuancing the proceeding of the county of Down ratholic meeting, has been received from a most res, ectable geatleman:

" ... " Newry - half past four -- Mon. 9th Sept.

" We assembled at one, and have concluded our business, victoriously, and well. The meeting was enormons, so much so, that the county court-house could not contain them, and one gentleman spoke from the street .- The influx of protestants of great wealth, was prodigious. The High heriff of Down, and his two brothers, were present; Colonels O, le and Hamilton; Counsellors Hamilton Moody, Caldwell a d Penns father, also attended; an energetic address was prefaced by an excellent speech from her Develyn, upon the catholic side, and seconded by Mr. Charles Trotter Ruthven, (who had been member for Downpatrick) upon the protestant side; when the general question was put, and carried unanimously, and was followed by a shout, which was echoed from the court house thro' the three principal streets."

"A very respectible catholic gentleman, Mr Magenia Savage, of Portaferry, was in the chair; and the old delegates were re-appointed with a change of three, and before their app mineral bey were seeming asked, whether they would, or would us to the meeting appeared, and the Newry catholics, very handsomely usued cards for a splendid dinner, to which we are about to sudown, to a considerable number of protestant gentle-

men and cathelics from the county.
