MEETING AT THE THATCHED HOUSE.

SORDON-TUESDAY, MARCH S.

Yesterday, pursuant to public notice, there was a numerous meeting of Noblemen and Gentlemen of the Protestant religion, connected with Ireland, to consider the propriety of signing petitions to both houses of Parliament, in favour of catholic emancipation. The meeting was attended by the Dukes of Bedford Devoushire, the Marquizes of Lassdowne and Down-shire, Earls Fitzwilliam and Moira, Lords Dudley and Ward, Mr. Grattan, Sir John Newport, Mr. Tighe, and many other Noblemen and Gentlemen .- Earl Fitzwill liam in the chair.

Sir J. Newport then addressed the meeting, and proposed a committee of seven persons, to carry the purpose of the meeting into effect. The following were

the names of the committee :-

The Earl of Moira, The Earl of Darnley,

The Duke of Devonshire, Right Hon G. Ponsonby. The Marquis of Downshire R. La Touche, Esq. Sir John Newport, Bart.

Who are invested with a discretionary power to add four to their number, if necessary. The meeting adjourned till monday, the 6th of April, to receive the report of the committee. The following are the contents of the petition :-

The petition of the undersigned protestant noblemen

and gentlemen, connected by birth or property with that part of the United kingdom called Ireland. "We, the subscribers hereunto, do most humbly petition your Lordships in favour of our brethern and

fellow-subjects, the persons professing the Roman ca-tholic religion. They apply to parliament to be ad-mitted to the privileges and Franchies of the constitu-

We, their protestant brethern, do consider such upplication to be just. We do most hartily join the eatholies in this their loyal and reasonable request; and, convinced of its policy, as well as its justice, we do moss scalowsly implore your Lordships to comply with the prayer of the said petition, and to relieve the persons professing the Roman catholic religion, from all civil and political disabilities."
