The learned and eloquent speaker represented the apprehension and anwillingness of the tyrant of Europe to expose his legions on these shores, if he understood they had to contend with the hardy peasantry of Ireland, fighting with hard and heart, in their own cause, and in league with a friendly government; that he was aware the bayonet would be found by him as irresistible in their hands here, as he has experienced it to be on the Continent. But if instead of cordiality and co-operation, he conceived disunion and discord to be the partion of our people, then indered would his apprehensions be changed into confidente and his destroying legions sent amongst us.
