Had the marauders waited a little longer, till Mr. Fitzpatrick (who had remained a short time on business at a neighbouring house), would have joined his assistant, they might possibly have obtained a better booty, as he had a large sum of money about his person at the time. It would be unjust were he not indemnified against this casualty.
