A PROCLAMATION for dissolving this present Parliament, and declaring the calling of auctior. " GEORGE, P. R.

"Whereas we, acting in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, think fit, by and with the advice of his Majesty's Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliamont, which stands prorogued to Friday the second day of October next: We do therefore, acting as aforesaid, publish this Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly; and the Lords spiris tual and temporal, and the knights, citizens, and burgesses, and the commissioners for shires and burghe, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their meeting and attendance on the said Friday the second day of October next: And we being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet his Majesty's perple, and to have their advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all his Majesty's loving subjects our will and pleasure to call a new Parliament; and sto hereby further declare, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, that, with the advice of his Majeric's Privy Council, we have this day given order, that the Charceller of that part of the United Kugdom cylled Great Britain, and the Chaucetlor of Ireland, do respectively forth with issue out writs, in due form and sccording to law, for calling a new Parliament: And we do hereby also, in the name and on the behalf of his Majesty, by this Proclamation under the great seal of the United Kingdom, require writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by the said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords spiritual and temporal, and Commons who are to surve in the said Parliament, to be duly returned to, and give their attendance in, the said Parliament; which writs are to be returnable on Tuesday, the 24th day of November next.

" Given at our court at Carlton house, the 29th day of September, 1812, and in the 524 year of his Majesty's reign.

" God save the King."
