To the Proprietor of The Limerick Gazette.

SIR, HAVING seen an Advertisement in your Paper of Friday last, publishing a Decree of the Consistorial Court of Limerick (at the Suit of Mrs. Elizabeth Hill, pretended Lloyd) against me, it is incumbent on me to repel so scandalous an outrage on Feeling and Justice. But the same audacity that urged them thro' their illegal proceedings, has induced them to the conscientious work of attempting to destroy my character. It is therefore necessary that I should bring my case in its true light before the eye of a discerning Public, which I mean to do in a Work now preparing for the Press. In the meantime, I shall only say, that a Protest has been entered against the proceedings of the Consistorial Court of Limerick, and Notice has been served of an Appeal to the Court of Cashel, and that I have two respectable witnesses to prove that Mrs. Hill's Husband was living at the time she claims a marriage with me—one of the witnesses was obliged to return to America—the opposite Proctor had notice to examine him, but they declined it. Being so advised, I caused him to be examined on oath before the Right Worshipful Andrew Watson, a Chartered Justice—not a witness has been brought forward to prove this pretended marriage, and all rests on the affidavit of a Mr. Fitzgibbin, an officer on foreign service, and a certificate of the marriage by a pretended Minister of the Gospel.
