haps of advantage to others. It may be well for
them to know that, possessed of whatever could
render life most justly dear and valuable to him, he
had taught himself to resign it with Christian forti-
tude; and thus left behind him the example, that
to meet death with faith and firmness, we must live
in truth and rectitude. Therefore, the tears of those
who are separated from him, though sorrowful, are
not bitter, as they know, that by imitating his vir-
tues, they may again be restored to him.
