Thaddeus O'Flynn, Titular Dean of the Diocese of Limerick—a gentleman of extensive learning, unostentatious piety, and unbounded charity; he bore a long and tedious illness with that meekness and resignation which distinguished him through life, and his death is sincerely lamented by every individual that had the pleasure of his acquaintance.—In Worcester, Mrs. Sheridan, relict of the late Charles Fitz Sheridan, Esq. formerly Secretary at War in Ireland, and brother of the Right Hon. R. B. Sheridan.—In Merrion-square, Dublin, in her 13th year, Elizabeth Catherine, eldest daughter of Owen Phibbs, Esq. late of Willowbrook, Co. Sligo.—In Prussia-street, Dublin, at the house of Mr. Claton, her son-in-law, Mrs. Curtis, late of Drogheda, at the advanced age of 83 years.—Mrs. Smith, wife of W. R. Smith, Esq. at Plymouth Dock.—In Cashel, John White, Esq. of that City—Lately, aged 43 years, Andrew Hollingworth, Esq. Mayor of Kingston upon-Tull—he was found drowned in the new dock at Portsmouth, having been missing the preceding evening. It is presumed that, being very short sighted, he had fallen in the dusk against some projecting substance, which by stunning and bewildering him, occasioned him to stagger into the water.—In Mountjoy-Place, Dublin, Mary, eldest daughter of Lieut.
