Dublin for Limerick, will arrive in this City, at 30 minutes past two o'clock each afternoon, and will depart from hence at eleven o'clock each morning. The Ennis mail will be conveyed by a coach from the same day, to leave Limerick at half-past three o'clock each afternoon, and arrive here at a quarter past ten o'clock each morning. The Rathfriland and Tralee Mails are to arrive and depart at the same hours of the Ennis. The Clonmel mail, which has hitherto arrived in this city at six o'clock A. M. will arrive at 35 minutes past 9 o'clock each morning, and to leave this at 10 o'clock.

Hutchinson arrived in this City from Cork and yesterday he was waited on by a Deputation from several Merchants, Bankers, &c. of this City, who presented him with an Address, to which he replied, in a speech of some length. He declined the honor of a public dinner which was intended for him, and this day he set off for London.

The Leitrim Regiment, just arrived at Cork from England, have marched to replace the Limerick City Militia at Cavan, &c.

The Carlow Militia embarked at Liverpool on Thursday last for Dublin.

Monday last, the 2d bat. 62d Regt. Foot marched to Cork on their route to Fermoy.

The Right Rev. Lord Bishop of Limerick arrived in London from Bath on Thursday last.

Yesterday the Right Hon. Colonel Vereker, Representative for this City, set off from hence to attend his duty in Parliament.

At the late Commission in Dublin, Mr. H. Morris was convicted of bigamy, for having married Mary Anne Murphy on the 15th May, 1811, having previously married Maria Fontaine on the 17th August, 1806, who was alive at the time of the second marriage; sentenced to be transported for seven years.

Saturday evening, a large lighter, deeply laden, in a sudden gust of wind, sunk off Connagh point—the crew were most humanely saved by the exertions of Mr. Darison, Captain of the Lady Frances, Kilrush packet, who, passing at the moment, went into his small boat, and rescued them from a watery grave.

Monday evening, the Right Worshipful Mayor held an inquest on the body of Michael Kennedy, an infant, who died that day;—it appeared that the child's mother with the boy in her arms, was attacked on Friday last, by Maurice Fitz-Gerald and Patrick Fitz-Gerald, rallors, who violently beat the woman; and the verdict of the Jury implied, that the death of the infant was partly caused by the fright or effects of the above assault.
